


SYNOPSIS

Hawala is a documentary that serves as both therapy and a journey into the human soul, recounting the harrowing experiences of Mohamed, Yeyinou, Natacha, and Zakaria, African migrants who are victims of trafficking. Through their voices, stories of abuse, violence, and betrayal emerge, faced along dangerous paths leading to Italy. The film portrays their shift from an initial reluctance to share their experiences to an emotional catharsis, revealing the indelible scars left by these events.

The testimonies include Natacha's story, seven months pregnant, who discovers she contracted HIV and transmitted it to her daughter; Yeyinou, a victim of sexual violence and ritual mutilation, struggling against trauma and suicide attempts; Mohamed, who fled political instability in Côte d'Ivoire, surviving slavery and torture; and Zakaria, a minor abandoned in the desert and subjected to violence, now at risk of losing his sight.

The universal voice of Binta, speaking in Mandinka, amplifies shared grief without the need for translation. The documentary denounces the trafficking and exploitation system associated with "Hawala," once an ancient money transfer method, now turned into a nightmare of violence and corporate profits. At the same time, it celebrates the resilience of those undertaking these perilous journeys to claim freedom and dignity, urging reflection on the dehumanization of lives reduced to the value of a wad of cash.

Enis Mulè ventures into the world of directing with his first documentary movie HAWALA. Whileit is his first experience as a director, he had had accumulated a significant artistic experience. Hehad debuted as a mime in theatre shows and in experimental dance notably in the TaoArt of Taormina and a programmer at the "MigrArti Film Fest" Film Festival in Sicily in 2018. This festival focused on crucial themes such as integration, peace and brotherhood among peoples, thus reflecting Enis' commitment to promoting positive messages through cinematic art.

Sabah, born in Algiers, Algeria. HAWALA is the first documentary feature film that I've directed together with the son Enis Mulè, an experience that has enriched me humanely and emotionally. My artistic career spans different areas: I am a theater, dance and short film direction teacher. I am also a choreographer and director of photography. For years I have passionately dedicated myself to the research and experimentation of the movements of the body and the visual arts in experimental cinema. I have had the privilege of being a dancer and choreographer for the maestro Franco Battiato and

to play the role of Artistic Director of the festival of cinema MigrArti Film Fest at Caltabellotta.

I have collaborated with various television and film festivals, and multimedia productions, contributing to my creative vision. I am the author of multiple works of drama, dance and experimentations that I've had the opportunity to give life to on the stages of antic theatres. Moreover, I have had the honor to be part of the jury of the 71st edition of Mostra del clnema di Venezia, in the session Orizzonte C I C A E, and of being the president of the jury at the International Festival of Zagora. These roles allow me to actively contribute to the valorization and the promotion of cinematographic art at the international level
